

THE NATIONAL CEMETERY DEDICATION.

Departure of Visitors—The Programme of the Day.

HARRISBURG, Wednesday, Nov. 18.

The special excursion train of the Governor left at 1½ o'clock for Gettysburgh. Among the principal dignitaries were Govs. Curtin, Seymour, Pierrepont and Brough; Gen. Vanderpool, of New-York; Col. Anderson, brother of Gen. Anderson; Govs. Tod, Dennison, and Bourman of West Virginia, and their respective Staffs; Gens. Doubleday, Stoneman and Stahel; Ex-Secretary Cameron; Clement C. Barclay, of Philadelphia, and the following members of Gov. Curtin's Staff: Gens. Irwin, King and Reynolds; Cols. J. H. Puleston, Roberts, Thomas, Wright and Quay, and Private Secretary George H. Morgan. The train will connect with the President's company at Hanover Junction, where the President will be received with becoming honors, and the whole party will then proceed to Gettysburgh. The attendance at the ceremonies will be very large. Numbers left here this morning in wagons, and the trains are crowded.

WASHINGTON, Wednesday, Nov. 18.

The French Minister, M. MERCIER, and Admiral RENAUD; the Italian Minister, M. BERTINATTI, and his Secretary of Legation, Mr. CORA, with Chevalier ISOLA and Lieut. MARTINEZ, of the Italian navy, and Mr. McDougall, of the Canadian Ministry, accompany the Secretary of State, Mr. SEWARD, to Gettysburgh to-day.
